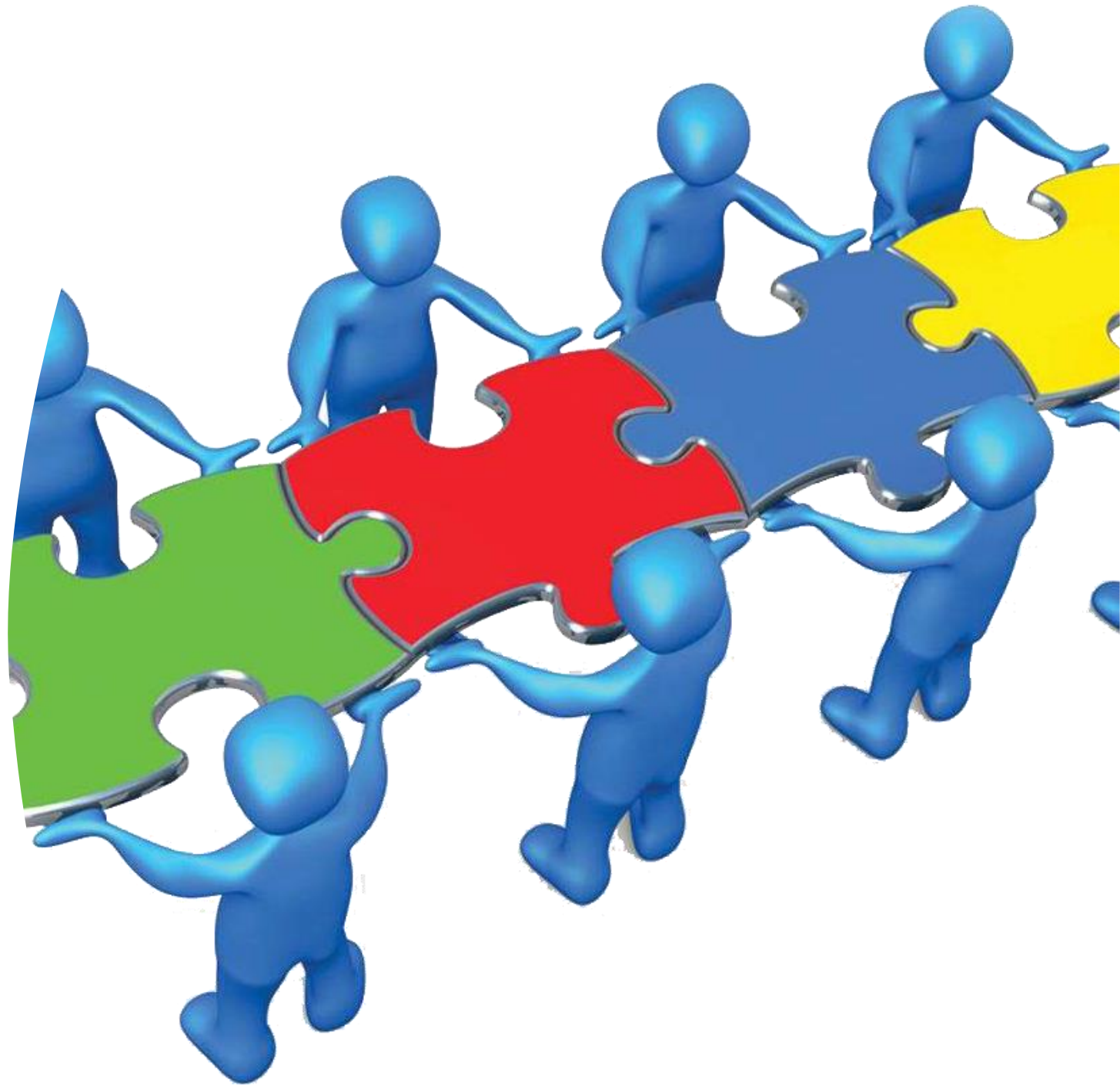
Plan For Today

Our Uniform

Black Blazer	To have the embroidered school badge. Blazers to be worn at all times. Blazers should only be removed with the permission of the classroom teacher.
Black jumper	This is optional. It must be V-neck with a purple stripe.
Tie	Black and purple stripe. Key Stage 3 – wide stripe. Key Stage 4 – narrow stripe. Senior Students – plain purple. Ties are to be worn at all times and knotted in such a way that the knot can be slid up to cover the top button at the collar of the shirt and hang correctly.
Black trousers	These should be in a traditional school style, classic smart, not tight or made from elasticated fabric.
Black skirts	Traditional school style, knee length, not tight or made from elasticated fabric.
White shirt	Shirts should be plain white with collar suitable for use with a tie. The shirt should be tucked in at all times and the top button must be fastened at all times.
Socks and tights	Black.
Footwear	Black leather shoes with a flat or low heel.
Outdoor clothing	Students should have an outdoor coat. Please ensure this coat provides maximum visibility on dark evenings. Denim jackets, hoodies and any clothing with offensive messages will be confiscated. Outdoor coats, scarfs, hats or gloves should not be worn indoors.
Hair	Hair colour should be natural. All hair which is tied back should be secured with discrete navy or black hair bands.
Jewellery	No jewellery should be worn with the exception of a wrist watch and one pair of ear studs worn in the ear lobe.
Make-up	No make-up should be worn. Any student wearing make-up will be asked to remove it. Nail varnish is not allowed. Long nails are not allowed for health and safety reasons.
